Main Points:

1. The Relevance of the Bible: Despite its age, the Bible addresses timeless human issues like sin, morality, and relationships.

Matthew 5:48 (NIV) - "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

- 2. Understanding Perfection
 - Two Forms of Perfection:
 - i. Positional Perfection: Justification by faith in Jesus Christ.
 - ii. Imparted Righteousness: The process of sanctification through the Holy Spirit.
- 3. Antitheses in Matthew 5
 - Murder and Anger:
 - i. Avoid not just murder but also anger and contempt.
 - Adultery and Lust:
 - ii. Avoid not just physical adultery but also lustful thoughts.
 - Divorce:
 - iii. Divorce is permitted but not required, even for marital unfaithfulness.
- 4. Living by the Spirit of the Law
 - i. Treat others with dignity and seek reconciliation.
 - ii. Remain pure and devoted to your spouse.

Bottom Line: God's children devote their hearts to the Father's complete holiness.
